	Competency and Drowning		<p>NOTE: Topic below is <i>only</i> to be taught for CPR AED course.</p> <p>Play Video</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play Opioid Overdose. • Guiding question: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – How do you administer naloxone? ▪ Hold the canister with your thumb on the bottom of the plunger and your pointer and middle fingers on either side of the nozzle. Insert the tip of the nozzle into the person's nostril and press the plunger. – After the video, remind students that naloxone may be found around public buildings, such as near a bleeding control kit or an AED. <p>Additionally, remind students that naloxone can usually be provided at low or no cost at their local health departments, pharmacies, or community foundations. Naloxone usually does not require a prescription.</p>
