With a growing number of telehealth education and certification choices, it's important to consider what matters to your career, practice and community. Certification offers enhanced provider expertise through display of the American Heart Association heart-check mark.

What does it mean to be a Certified Professional by the American Heart Association (CPAHA) – Telehealth Stroke?

This certification program offers individual professionals a self-directed opportunity to validate their knowledge and experience in telehealth stroke principals and care delivery. Certification is valid for three years.

Eligibility Requirements



Be a licensed medical professional including physicians, advanced practice providers, nurses, paramedics, clinical pharmacists, and other licensed health care professionals engaged in the stroke chain of survival utilizing telehealth.



Complete 10 stroke or telehealth CEUs (continuing education)

How To Get Started

1

Complete the prerequisite requirements and purchase the certification exam.* You will receive an email from Meazure Learning to schedule your live remotely proctored exam. You will have three hours to complete the 175-questions (140 scored questions, 35 unscored questions).

2

Pass the exam. Upon achieving a passing score, the American Heart Association will award you with the CPAHA certification and credentials for individual recognition in accordance with the provided branding guidelines.

3

Maintain. To retain the certification past the three-year award period, you must meet certification maintenance criteria with continuing education credits and fees. If the certification is not maintained, it is no longer active for professional use and display.

*Candidates have up to a year to complete the certification exam. Access to the CPAHA Candidate Handbook is included. The Candidate Handbook contains information on content outlines, maintenance requirements, sample questions and more.
