2020 AHA Guidelines HeartCode® ACLS Course

Purpose	To provide direction and information on updates to the 2020 AHA Guidelines HeartCode Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) Course and training options for providers who need to complete ACLS training.
General Information	<p>The HeartCode ACLS Course has been updated to reflect new science and training recommendations in the 2020 AHA Guidelines for CPR and ECC.</p> <p>HeartCode ACLS is the online portion of ACLS blended learning that prepares students for hands-on practice and testing of ACLS skills. It uses a personalized adaptive algorithm that sets learners on the most efficient path to ACLS mastery. Learners follow a continuously adapting learning path that is personalized by the learner's own inputs: Their performance, and their self-reported confidence level related to each probe. The course content is presented in the form of self-directed learning content, probes, and Cognitive Assessment Activities. After completing the eLearning component, students complete a hands-on skills session with an AHA ACLS Instructor or on voice-assisted manikins that provide real-time audio and visual feedback.</p>
Course Information for Training Centers and Instructors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Effective February 1, 2021, only 2020 AHA Guidelines ACLS Provider Course materials can be used for conducting all ACLS Provider Courses. • ACLS Training Centers and Instructors may continue to use previous stock of 2015 Guidelines version HeartCode ACLS licenses and all ACLS Interim Training Materials posted on the AHA Instructor Network through January 31, 2021. • The Instructor-led hands-on skills session for HeartCode ACLS can be conducted by current ACLS Instructors. Instructors must complete the 2020 AHA Guidelines Instructor Update Course for ACLS before conducting skills sessions. 2020 AHA Guidelines Instructor Updates are available through the AHA Instructor Network (login required). • Appropriate course completion cards must be issued for the course materials being used. If 2015 Guidelines version HeartCode ACLS is used, a 2015 ACLS Provider eCard must be issued. If the new 2020 HeartCode ACLS is used, a 2020 ACLS Provider eCard must be issued. • ACLS Instructors are strongly encouraged to complete the ACLS Product and Course Orientation (P&CO) available through the AHA Instructor Network (login required). The ACLS P&CO was created to aid ACLS Instructors in understanding the new course design and teaching strategies. • It is also highly recommended that ACLS Instructors become familiar with the HeartCode ACLS online portion of the course prior to conducting hand-on skills sessions with students. • The hands-on skills session for the HeartCode ACLS Course can be conducted after successful completion of the online portion. The AHA does not require a timeframe for completing the skills session.
