Description

The ACLS for Experienced Providers course is designed primarily for seasoned healthcare providers who manage complex cardiovascular, respiratory and other emergencies. Through didactic instruction and active participation in case-based scenarios, learners will enhance their skills in the diagnosis and treatment of pre-arrest, arrest, and post-arrest patients. The goal of the ACLS for Experienced Providers course is to improve outcomes in complex cardiovascular, respiratory, and other emergencies by expanding on core ACLS guidelines using critical decision-making strategies.

Learning Objectives

At the conclusion, participants should be able to

1. Demonstrate proficiency in providing BLS care, including prioritizing chest compressions and integrating AED use
2. Recognize and manage respiratory arrest
3. Recognize and manage cardiac arrest until termination of resuscitation or transfer of care, including immediate post-cardiac arrest care
4. Demonstrate effective communication as a leader or member of a resuscitation team and recognize the impact of team dynamics on overall team performance
5. Apply the expanded systematic approach to patient assessment, evaluation and management of complex cardiovascular, respiratory, and other emergencies
