




Post 2 (3 graphic sliders):

Sudden cardiac arrest is when the heart malfunctions and suddenly stops beating. It can occur when an electrical malfunction in the heart causes an arrhythmia, or irregular heartbeat. Death occurs within minutes if a person doesn't receive treatment.






